About: For the WVU Libraries' 6th Art in the Libraries collaborative exhibition, we explore how artificial intelligence (AI) is transforming fields of study, work, career readiness, community engagement, and daily life. In 2023, the Art in the Libraries committee invited campus-wide submissions on AI in creative work. Along with showcasing contributions from students, staff, and scholars, we took a unique approach—curating the exhibit with the help of AI, itself, with human edits along the way.

AI has rapidly become a driving force in sectors like healthcare, entertainment, finance, and transportation. While it offers remarkable innovations, it also raises important ethical, privacy, and bias concerns. The exhibit explores both the opportunities and challenges AI presents, inviting reflection on how it will shape—and be shaped by—our shared future. The exhibit will appear on all three Morgantown campuses and travel to WVU Beckley and Keyser campuses with potential for more.
